County by County reports for Crawford, Erie, Mercer and Venango

FRENCH CREEK – flowing through all four counties

Aaron @ French Creek Fishing Company; filed 5/9: Fishing is starting to really pick up for a variety of species around the area. Trout are still being caught throughout the stocked sections of French Creek. Drifting a French Creek Fishing Company 2-inch Sand Worm or Stonefly has been very effective. Panfish, northern pike and bass are biting around Presque Isle Bay using a variety of soft plastics under a slip bobber rig. Also, walleyes are being taken at mouths of Erie tributary creeks and from the South Pier.



CRAWFORD COUNTY

Pymatuning Lake

Bean @ Richter's Bait; filed 5/9: The daytime walleye is picking up with fish being taken by drifting with crawlers or minnows on the South End. A 7-lb walleye was taken this week by trolling a crankbait. I'm still seeing a lot of big perch come in. And we are finally hearing about crappies being taken in shallow bays on the South End. Anglers have been catching and releasing some impressive smallmouth bass as well. *Laurie @ Duck-n-Drake*; filed 5/9: I'm hearing the crappie bite up north was tough the last couple days, with the best catches being from around Red Cross area. A few walleyes are being caught by trolling shad-like crankbaits. Our first 2022 catfish tournament two weeks ago was a success; many channel catfish were weighed plus one flathead. We have a second catfish tournament on May 21st. Anglers in the Crappie Madness contest have been bringing in a good number of big fish. The leading crappie right now is heavier than last year's winner; maybe we will see a 3-pounder! (See photos)

Becky @ Gateway Bait; filed 5/9: Crappie at Red Cross; perch off the causeway; and lots of catfish everywhere!

Bo @ B.C. Baits; fled 5/8: A quick trip to Pymatuning produced 24 mixed panfish (including some nice crappies) in 2.5 feet of water off a beaver hut using a chartreuse medium Terry Bug. (See photo)

David Graham @ FX Rod Representative; filed 5/8: This past week RJ and I finished 3rd in Crawford County's Open Tournament. We targeted a nice school of smallmouth with jerkbaits; we located the smallies during practice. Late in tourney, we went after pre-spawn largemouth bass with jigs and spinnerbaits. Every year it is different – this year the grass is way behind and the water temperature will not move out of

the 50s. Always a new challenge – that's what I love about fishing the most. (See photo) Today, May 8th, in our club tournament I used my FX flipping rod to land a 6pound largemouth. (See photo)

Brock "Captain Hook" Morocco

(Hermitage); filed 5/6: Not doing as much fishing this spring. But I did nail a nice walleye one evening at Pymatuning, along with several smaller ones I released. (See photo)

Conneaut Creek



Adam Horne; filed 5/4: I fished Conneaut Creek on the 3rd. Trout are still there and active. I landed several on spinners and by tight-line drifting with a fly rod. Working the head and tail of riffles seemed to hold the most active bites. Also missed a steelhead – but it was a thrill to still



have steelhead this far upstream at this time of year. Doubt they will be in the creeks much longer. Fish On! (See photos)

ERIE COUNTY

Presque Isle Bay & Lake Erie

Capt. George Mro @ Bass Fishing Charters; filed 5/9: Lots of wind has Lake Erie a little stained which has slowed the smallmouth bite some, but there are still plenty of cooperative fish mostly in the 6 to 10-foot range. Moving baits like crankbaits and jerkbaits work well when the wind is ripping, then swimbaits, Ned Rigs and tubes at calmer times. (See photos at right)

Kirk @ East End Angler; filed 5/9: Anglers are catching

perch off both the North and South Pier, but no reports of perch in the main lake. Smallmouth bass bite is strong in both the Bay and the main Lake. Lake trout have moved slightly deeper in the Lake to around 60 to 65



feet; reports are they are not schooled up as tightly as weeks ago

but split into little pods. For right now, chances are better to land a walleye at night in the Bay off a pier or at the mouth of a tributary creek on the main lake than to go hunting them on Erie proper; suspending stick baits are the best baits. (See photos)

Anthony @ Poor Richards; filed 5/9: Lots of bass in the tributaries; steelhead have pretty much vacated the streams. Best walleye bite is casting in the Bay at night and at

west side creek mouths. I'm hearing about lots of northern pike being caught in the Bay, plus crappies and bluegills in the Head of Bay. Walnut Creek Access is finally open to all boats!

Becky @ Elk Creek Sports; filed 5/9: Elk Creek is at a perfect level for bass fishing; lots of suckers in the stream, too. Hearing only limited success at creek mouths for walleye due largely to persistent winds.



The Last Steelhead

Bill @ Tudors; filed 5/9: Nearly all steelhead have dropped back from headwaters of tributaries; there are some in the lower reaches near the mouths of stream. With approaching warm spell, all steelhead will be

gone. More smallmouths have moved Now Smallmouth Hevean into some of the tributaries. The best



lures for these stream smallmouths are in-line spinner like a Mepps for spin anglers or a large streamer for fly anglers. (photos above right)

Keith @ Dutch Fork Custom Lures; filed 5/6: Bass and pike in Presque Isle are chomping tubes, jerkbaits and crankbaits. Weeds are emerging, and bass are all over the place. Water temperature is just right for a good time. Lake smallmouth fishing is heating up with my buddy Capt. Elder from XTR charters catching a smallie over 7 pounds! 
MERCER COUNTY

Lake Wilhelm

Bo @ B.C. Baits; filed 5/8: I caught several crappies from 15 feet of water right on the first drop-off out from shore. Water temp was 54 degrees. I marked a large school of crappies on my Garmin as they were staged to move up to spawn. I was using an Eagles Milk medium Terry Bug. (See photo at right)

Kevin @ Luckis4rabbits; filed 5/9: All the crappies I caught the other day had beat up tails, letting me know that the males are starting to make beds. It won't be long before the crappie spawn on Shenango. I was fishing my hand-tied jigs 12 to 18 inches below a Thill stick bobber on



my 9-foot Eagle Claw rod and 4-pound-test line. I used jigs in three different colors, and they all caught crappies. Messenger on Facebook from my Luckis4rabbits page for more information on my custom hand-tied jigs. (Photos)

Randy @ Fish West PA; filed 5/9: Shenango Lake water level is what we call Spring high but fish are moving shallow and getting active. Good reports of crappie, white bass, walleye, bass and even catfish are coming in daily. It will just get better from here on out until the dog days of summer arrive. On Monday, I landed a 3.8-pound white bass – my Personal Best. Tight Lines, Randy. (See photos below– Jim Derr with LMB)

VENANGO COUNTY

Sugar Creek

Angler Al @ Buttermilk Hill; filed 5/7: The Fish Commission's annual 2nd stocking of Sugar Creek usually occurs on the first Thursday in May. They put several thousand trout into the stream. Mostly rainbows and browns, a fair number of palominos. Using spinners and drifted Trout Magnets, Mikey broke his personal record by catching 39 trout in a single day! Paul Crider from Warren, Pa, was fishing near us; he landed this colorful 18-inch palomino. He caught it on a homemade CP Spinner. In addition to all day Thursday, Mikey and I also spent a couple hours on Friday and Saturday trout fishing on Sugar. Our combined total catch and release for that period was 94 trout. Most of those were caught by Mikey on orange, white & red, and pink Trout Magnets. I caught most of mine on pieces of nightcrawler.

Allegheny River

Jeff @ Keystone Connection Guide Service; filed 5/8:

Though the high water continues to plague the middle Allegheny, I've managed to squeeze in a few more guide trips between such events. Those outings produced excellent numbers of smallmouth bass up to 20 inches on Ned Rigstyle finesse plastics, hair jigs and Galida's Grubz. Fish have

been taken in moderate current in mid-depths of four to eight feet of water. Once the river recedes from the most recent deluge, I expect smallmouth bass will be found in pre-spawn staging areas and will move onto spawning flats as the water warms. (See photo upper right) *Alan Shrout*; filed 5/8: The bite was slow for us on the Allegheny this past week, but I did hook into an 8-pound 4-ounce flathead catfish. He hit a swimbait. He gave me a fun battle! (See photo right) *Pete @ SmalliesontheYough.com*; filed 4/27: My wife and I



fished the Allegheny on April 25th. It was a warm day and smallies were eating. We caught them on everything we threw, from soft plastics to crankbaits. We landed all sizes of smallies – from 10 inches to 20 inches. What a great time to be on the water! (See photos left and right)

GAMMA TIP from Darl Black

Right now! This is my favorite time to be on almost any area lake to fish for smallmouth bass, largemouth bass, big crappies, rock bass and white bass. With water temperature between 50 and 60 degrees, all these species are in the shallows, and you really don't know what you will catch on your next cast.

Marilyn and I will rig four 6-1/2 to 7-foot med-light or med power spinning rods with a finesse single hook bait such as 2-inch tubes, Ned Rig, wacky-rigged Yum Dinger, Galida's Grubz and small hair jigs. All reels are spooled with 6-pound Gamma Edge.





Then we simply pick out a flat bank with gravelly bottom with some scattered emerging vegetation and wood cover, position the boat between 6 and 8 feet of water – so we are within an easy cast of shore line – then run the bank on the electric. Dozens of fish will be caught, including a few bruiser bass in the 3 to 4-pound range. An occasional walleye turns up, or big carp, and usually one of us hooks a muskie. Gamma Edge 6 pound handles all comers; it's the best line for finesse jigs or small grubs.




Garmin Tip from Gus Glasgow at G&G Marine Electronics:



The picture of my two boys each holding a fish was from this past week on Lake Arthur. Those fish were stacked on off-shore brush in 10' of water. I couldn't tell if they spawned or not, but every pile I went to was loaded with fish. I used the LVS34 to pick out the biggest fish, catch it, and move on. I have little time to fish, and LiveScope helps me save time finding and catching. All fish were caught on hand-tied jigs that I

made myself. All fish were caught via sniping with a 14' rod. I can sneak right up on these fish with my Garmin Force trolling motor. It's brushless making it almost completely silent in the water. Fish do not spook at all with a brushless motor. Check the screens below.
