It's been a hot July – a record setter in terms of heat. Many anglers of a certain age (myself included) cannot take the extreme sun exposure and unprecedented high temperatures. Nonetheless, for those who ventured out there were some outstanding fishing opportunities: Lake Erie offshore walleye fishing; smallmouth bass on the Allegheny River; and white bass at Shenango Lake. These summer bites should continue through most of August – unless we get a sudden dramatic drop in temperatures. There were also a number of BIG fish caught in August; check these out in the Report.

Marcy @ French Creek Adventures; filed 7/23: Check out these great catches by some of customers from upper French Creek. Surprises from upper creek.



CRAWFORD COUNTY

Pymatuning Lake

Bean @ Richter's Bait & Tackle; 8/2: Anglers on the South End fishing just beyond the deep weedline edges in about 10 feet of water with a jig-n-crawler are still catching some walleyes, as well as a few decent perch. Crappies have apparently gone on vacation somewhere as catch-reports on them are non-existent. I've seen some boats fishing for muskies, but no reports of catches.

Laurie @ Duck-n-Drake; filed 8/2: a brisk walleye bite continues for those trolling north of Andover Causeway and mid-section of the lake below the Causeway. Up north they are trolling Shad Rap type lures in 10 to 12 feet of water at 2.4 mph. In the mid-section off Duck-N-Drake & Ohio campground, anglers are successful in 18 feet of water with a slightly slower speed. We heard of some decent bass being caught, as well as bluegills. Crappies are quiet. August 19th is our next Catfish Tournament; tournament hours are 7 p.m. on the 19th to 7 a.m. morning of the 20th. Stop by the shop this week for more information.

Captain Hook (Hermitage); filed 7/28: I caught this nice largemouth bass while fishing from shore last week at Pymatuning. (See photo)

Patty @ Poff's Place; filed 8/2: Oh, they are still picking up some walleyes and perch, in addition to all the catfish. No crappies have been reported – don't know what has happened with them. Reports for all species have slowed in July due to anglers not fishing as a result of the extremely uncomfortable temperatures.


Conneaut Lake

Jesse @ Windy's Bait & Tackle; filed 8/2: Anglers stopping in at our shop are primarily fishing Conneaut Lake and Pymatuning Lake. During the summer, it seems a lot of casual anglers are fishing from shore, with a variety of panfish species and catfish being caught. Boat anglers at Pymatuning report some walleyes and smallmouth bass. Boat anglers at Conneaut seem to be catching mainly bass and perch.

Marilyn Black @ Blackwolfe Communications; filed 8/2: During July and August, Conneaut Lake is our favorite lake to fish. Of course, we only fish it during weekdays – never on a weekend or holiday due to crazy boating traffic. While the bite at Pymatuning and Wilhelm seems to stumble during the hottest part of the year, we find consistent

success at Conneaut for crappies, bluegills, pumpkinseeds, largemouth bass, small-mouth bass and northern pike. Some days are tougher than others, but we always catch something. And there is a new species on the lake you might try to hook when hungry but you will need greenbacks and cell phone to catch it...the boatuspizza. Yes, there is a pizza delivery boat! ERIE COUNTY

Lake Erie

Kirk @ East End Angler; filed 8/2: Lots of walleyes on the east side, especially off Shades. Lots and lots of walleyes. They are everywhere from 30 feet depth out to 80 feet depth, mostly holding in water column between 40 and 60 feet. Guys are catching them from canoes and kayaks! Ridiculous numbers of fish. Most anglers are getting limits of keepers but must wade through a lot of short ones — which hold promise for next year. I can barely keep up with the demand for crawlers. I was at a seminar the other night where the PFBC biologist for Erie said their sampling nets in 48 feet of water are loaded with yellow perch — but no one is fishing for them since the walleye bite is so good. For a change of pace, I am also hearing of some anglers catching crappies off the South Pier simply casting a hook bait with a minnow or couple maggots, and weighted with only a couple split-shot; cast out and let it drift in the current.

Bill @ Tudor's Hook N Nook at Elk Creek Sports; filed 8/2: Walleyes are everywhere. Shallow, deep and in between – it's unreal. If you can float a boat on the Lake, good chance you will get a limit. Of course, crawler harnesses continue to produce, but small spoons trolled fast are working as well.

Capt. Bob @ Perch Pirate; filed 8/2: Walleyes are here and we are catching them on the Perch Pirate. If you know how to fish an Erie Dearie on the sweep, or are willing to learn, you'll catch walleye with us, too. We have been picking up incidental perch as well. I understand some of the charter boats are catching steelhead in the 90-to-100-foot depths; these steelhead are starting to stage for the fall run.

XTR Fishing Charters; filed 7/28: Lots of good walleye being caught outside the pack of



smaller fish; targeting 65' - 75' and as deep as 90' at times. With lots of fish staying high in the water column. Out into the 85'-90' we have been running additional lines for steelhead. 400 weighted steel and 300 weighted steel with spoons. Five core and Bomber 24s have been the bread winners. Jet 30s and small spoons to target the bug eaters at first light have added to the box. Out speed at ball has been picking

up 2.6 to 2.8 mph average. 3.0 divers 110' back as far as 160'. 1.5 divers 65' back. Riggers have been producing well at 45' down and deeper. I anticipate the high fish to fall down soon and the river bite will dominate. Stay safe. XTR Fishing Charters. (Photo left)

Ken Smith (Sharon); filed 7/28: Couple friends and I fished Lake Erie in late July. Nice morning but the waves picked up just as we finished our three-man limit. We went out as far as 71 feet as we were marking fish constantly. Puts the dipsys down. Number one was set at 125 and number three was at 165, post and starboard. Headed south and finished in 58 feet of water. Good day with Ron and Ed! (photo right)





Dave Ohmer (Erie); filed 7/26: I went out on Erie from Walnut Creek in my kayak to locate walleye in 50 to 60 feet. Vertical jigging a SteelShad on 10-pound Gamma Edge produced 6 walleyes. (photo left) **Denny Beggs** (Franklin); filed 7/28: Nice 12



-inch perch from Presque Isle Bay. (photo right)

Capt. George Mro @ Bass Fishing Charters; filed 7/31: Lake Erie bass fishing is in full summer patterns. Smallmouth are all in the main lake. Bigger fish are in the 25-to-30-foot depths on isolated boulders and rock piles. Don't expect great numbers but quality fish are there. Fish are coming on dropshot, tubes and some on swimbaits. Expect to catch some bonus walleye as well as bass. Walleyes are everywhere. The largemouth bite in the Bay has been great. Texas rigged plastics, jigs and Chatter baits on deep weed edges have been the way to go, plus topwaters early mornings with calm surface...who does not love a topwater blowup! These patterns should hold through August. Tight lines, Capt. George. (Photos next page and in Livwell)

VENANGO COUNTY

Angler Al's August Diary for Justus Lake, Sugar Creek and French Creek

- 7/9: for many years the week of the July 4th holiday has been a fishing reunion for my brother-in-law Doc Das and I. It was nice that Mikey could join us on a few of those days as well. Together we fished French Creek, Justus Lake and Sugar Creek. I kept count of our catch:
 - 77 Rainbow Trout
 - 66 Smallmouth Bass
 - 8 Brown Trout
 - 5 Largemouth Bass
 - 1 Northern Pike
 - Total catch for the first week of July was 157 gamefish All released!

We drifted red worms and small pieces of nightcrawler, plus small live minnows for trout in Sugar Creek. Used larger creek bait for bass at Justus Lake and French Creek. Using a fly rod, the following presenta-

tions worked great for smallmouth bass: #8, #10 and #12 brown and black spring lizards.

For trout we used brown caddis nymph, bead head prince nymph, San Juan worm, and black or olive wooly bugger.

At Justus Lake I caught a northern pike. (See cover) I've been fishing Justus Lake since the late 70s. I've caught a lot of fish from this body of water, but never hooked up with a northern pike. Never heard of a northern pike being caught from Justus Lake. So, when I hooked into the monster 40-inch pike, I immediately assumed it was a big purebred muskellunge or a tiger musky, having caught both from Justus before. Wore the fish down some, got it to the boat, Mikey quickly netted it and very quickly a photo was snapped so I could immediately release it. Only after the fish swam away did I review the photo. I was shocked to see the markings indicated a purebred northern pike rather than a musky! This fish had huge proportions for a pike. I didn't get it on a scale, but I would say it was a solid 25 pounds but could have been more. Mikey did a fantastic net job and Doc captured the event on my GoPro. Thanks to both. PTL from Angler Al.




During late July trips to Justus, I caught two exceptional largemouth bass – a four pounder and a five pounder on one trip and several smaller bass one evening with Darl Black. All came on large live creek bait fished in 22 to 30 feet of water.

The last day of July, I fished Sugar Creek for trout. I took my usual nightcrawlers and minnows. Caught 11 rainbows on pieces of crawler and 3 on minnows. None were larger than 12 inches. All were re-5-lb lmb Justus Lake leased. (See photos of some August catches here, and the big pike on the cover.)


Allegheny River

Jeff @ Keystone Connection Guide Service; filed 7/31: July provided outstanding fishing for smallmouth bass on the middle Allegheny River. My guide trips produced excellent numbers of all sizes of bass up to 20 inches. Soft jerkbaits, Rapala X-Raps, and topwater have all been good. (See photos below)









Mike Jones; filed 7/19: Friends and I canoed the Allegheny last week from Franklin to Emlenton. Lots of decent-size smallmouth plus a few that went 4 to 4.5 pounds. We used vintage plugs (Beno's) and black Mann's Worms on 1/8-oz jig heads. We concentrated on pools most people cannot get to without a




canoe or kayak. However, there was a lot of grass in the river. (See photos left & right)

Pete @ SmalliesontheYough Guide Service – Pete's Allegheny August Diary

- 7/6: I did some scouting today on the river for upcoming trips. The bite was pretty good for a hot sunny day. I was catching fish in the 13-to-16-inch range, but nothing bigger. I did lose one about 18 inches as I was landing it. As I was leaving, I thought to try one more spot where I have caught a few bigger smallies. Well, it worked! I landed a river giant of 21 inches, and got the picture!
- 7/14: A great day today. We started catching fish on the second cast of the day. It didn't stop. We had action all day long in typical summer spots. We used Gamma Edge in the clear waters of Allegheny.
- 7/16: Another great start! First cast caught a 20-inch small-mouth. The river is on fire right now. We had hook-ups with all sizes of fish today, landing a bunch in the 17-to-18-inch range with a few in the 19-to-20-inch range.
- 7/19: This was a fantastic day on the Allegheny from start to finish. The smallies were eating everything from topwater to tubes. We crushed them. I also landed a huge 22-inch smallmouth. What a river!
- 7-24: Great Day to be fishing for river smallmouth. There were patterns throughout the day that worked with summer peak in effect. These fish are fat and eating everything. I used Gamma Edge 6-lb. test in the ultra-clear water. If interested in a wade trip, contact me at pete@smalliesontheyough.com.
- 7/26: A different day on the river. Tons of floating algae in the entire water column. It was bad. Every cast we had to clear it off the line or the lure. We did catch fish in the 12-to-15-inch range with one hitting the 19-inch mark.
